Comes now the United States of America by and through the United States Attorney for the Northern District of Mississippi and respectfully moves the Court to continue the defendant, JOSEPH C. LANGSTON's report date to the United States Bureau of Prisons. In support whereof the government would respectfully show unto the Court the following facts, to-wit:

1.

On December 16, 2008, JOSEPH C. LANGSTON was sentenced by the Court to three years in the custody of the United States Bureau of Prisons. He was permitted to execute a voluntary surrender form and has been ordered to report to the Bureau of Prisons before 2:00 p.m. on January 15, 2009.

JOSEPH C. LANGSTON is a crucial witness in an ongoing government investigation. It would be most helpful to have him available for personal conferences and telephone calls here in the Northern District of Mississippi.

Accordingly, JOSEPH C. LANGSTON's plea of guilty is final and his sentence has been imposed. The government simply asks that he be kept available to government investigators until further order of the Court.
