**ORDER DENYING MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION**

Before the Court is [387] Plaintiff's request for reconsideration of the Court's text order entered July 7, 2009. The order in question held moot [368] Plaintiff's motion for an order requiring Nationwide to serve responses by July 2, 2009, to discovery Plaintiff propounded on June 17, 2009. Under the Rules, Nationwide's responses to the discovery were due the day discovery ends, July 17, 2009. However, on July 6, 2009, Nationwide filed [377, 378, 379] notice of service of responses to the discovery, and the Court mooted Plaintiff's motion to expedite.

In the present motion Plaintiff contends that Nationwide's discovery responses are insufficient, and requests that the Court "immediately enter an order" requiring Nationwide to fully respond to her interrogatories and requests for production. Without explanation or citation of any authority, Plaintiff states she is "unable to file a motion to compel until the full time period in which Nationwide has to respond to the discovery has elapsed;" that she "simply can do nothing to compel further, more complete responses until this Court enters a ruling making the responses actually *due*."

The Court declines to enter an order setting a due date for discovery responses which have already been served, and finds no merit in Plaintiff's motion for reconsideration of its order mooting Plaintiff's motion to expedite the time for such responses. It is therefore,

**ORDERED** that the motion for reconsideration is denied, this the 14<sup>th</sup> day of July, 2009.
