6	Clem Donelon:	It is my position. Whether this is a pre-disciplinary hearing or not is
7		another matter and whether or not there is a pre-disciplinary hearing that
8		may follow is another matter.
9	Ms. Vandenweghe:	So this is not a pre-disciplinary hearing? What is this then?
1.0	Clem Donelon:	A meeting.
11	Ms. Vandenweghe:	About? Putting me on paid administrative leave.
12	Clem Donelon:	Yes.
13	Ms. Vandenweghe:	And that's not a disciplinary action?
14	Clem Donelon:	Not with me it isn't, and under the personnel rules it's not.
15	Steve Theriot:	It is not an appealable action if you are in classified service.
16	Ms. Vandenweghe:	You are entitled to your opinion but not your facts.
17	Steve Theriot:	Well
18	Ms. Vandenweghe:	Anything further, gentleman?
19	Steve Theriot:	The only thing that The only other thing I needed to ask you that if you,
20		in fact, had a personal laptop computer or any other device that you might
21		have downloaded any public information parish information?
22	Ms. Vandenweghe:	I have a external hard drive that we use to return documents to the Feds
23		and to the media - my personal hard drive that I had to pay for because

1		there was no money, according to Mr. Wilkinson. So I discussed that with
2		Louis Is that correct, Louis?
3	Louis Gruntz:	Yes.
4	Ms. Vandenweghe:	I'd like to identify all the parties in here today. Would you all identify
5		yourselves, please?
6	Junior Mendoza:	Junior Mendoza.
7	Bert Smith:	Bert Smith.
8	Deano Bonano:	Deano Bonano.
9	Steve Theriot:	Steve Theriot.
10	Jose Gonzalez:	Jose Gonzalez.
11	Louis Gruntz:	Louis Gruntz.
12	Clem Donelon:	Clement Donelon.
13	Ms. Vandenweghe:	Okay. Louis?
14	Louis Gruntz:	Yeah, you did have a, uh, personal hard drive that we would use in the

23		sure when you all are ready you can request it the way I'm going to
24		request the records that I want from this hearing today. I would ask that a

1		litigation hold be placed immediately on all the documents that you have
2		based your decision on today to put me on paid administrative leave and I
3		would like to see the litigation hold letter that goes out. I will be
4		requesting that. And I will want to know where the documents are being
5		held. I will want my computer placed on a litigation hold.
6	Steve Theriot:	The legislative auditors have your computer.
7	Ms. Vandenweghe:	That does not relieve the parish of the obligation to put a litigation hold
8		out.
9	Steve Theriot:	Again, I'll, uh, I'll confer with legal counsel for some guidance.
10	Ms. Vandenweghe:	Anything further?
11	Steve Theriot:	Are you What about the other computers that were in your possession?
12	Ms. Vandenweghe:	They are in the file cabinet, which is why the office was locked.
13	Steve Theriot:	Which is Is that the one for Whitmer and for
14	Ms. Vandenweghe:	I don't know who they are for. I have two laptop computers that Ridley
15		placed in the file cabinet in my office.
16	Steve Theriot:	What do you have on your own personal computer of the parish?
17	Ms. Vandenweghe:	I don't have a personal computer.
18	Clem Donelon:	Well, what you are suggesting
19	Steve Theriot:	On the external hard drive.
20	Clem Donelon:	On the hard drive. Do you know what it is?
21	Ms. Vandenweghe:	I have no idea. Whatever was downloaded by the various people here. But
22		then I had my own pictures and all the work that I do on it.
23	Clem Donelon:	Can you give us a list of what is on the hard drive that is parish?
24	Ms. Vandenweghe:	I'm sure that you'll be able to subpoena that whenever you need to.

2	Clem Donelon:	Mr. Theriot said he wants to know what's on your computer that's parish
3		property. I think as an employee you have an obligation to cooperate with
4		that request.
5	Ms. Vandenweghe:	As a whistleblower I also have rights
6	Clem Donelon:	You do.
7	Ms. Vandenweghe:	and you all have obligations and responsibilities.
8	Clem Donelon:	This is true.
9	Ms. Vandenweghe:	So for that reason, I am going to respectfully decline to give you any
10		information at this time.
11	Clem Donelon:	Your whistleblower status doesn't insulate you, Mary Ann
12	Ms. Vandenweghe:	Anne Marie.
13	Clem Donelon:	Anne Marie, from your requirements as an employee. You still have
14		obligations as an employee.
1.5	Ms. Vandenweghe:	I'm on paid administrative leave at this time?
16	Steve Theriot:	No, you're
17	Ms. Vandenweghe:	I will consult with my counsel and I will advise you of my decision.
18	Steve Theriot:	[Unintelligible 07:47] responsibility [Unintelligible 07:49] notify the U. S.
19		Attorney that you have property of the parish that you're taking off with
20		you and not resolved with the parish.
21	Ms. Vandenweghe:	And what property would that be?
22	Steve Theriot:	The information that's on that hard drive.
23	Ms. Vandenweghe:	I was not I was asked to do that.

2		have information on that hard drive
3	Ms. Vandenweghe:	Mmhm.
4	Steve Theriot:	I was directed by the U. S. Attorney to make sure that I protect all of

6		[Unintelligible 08:19].
7	Ms. Vandenweghe:	The U. S. Attorney has all of those documents. They mirrored my
8		computer and they have everything that is on that hard drive.
9	Steve Theriot:	I understand.
10	Ms. Vandenweghe:	So you can certainly contact the U. S. Attorney.
11	Steve Theriot:	I most certainly will. I mean, in order to comply with thewith the prior,
12		uh, letter or at least the
13	Ms. Vandenweghe:	They are already aware of this hearing and they have requested that
14		anything I have I give to them.
